

MERC @ APCCMPD Scholars is open to clinicians interested in improving their educational research skills and ability to participate in medical education research projects. After completion of six courses, the learner will earn a Certificate in Medical Education Research.

At the completion of the MERC @ APCCMPD Scholars Program, learners will:

- demonstrate a foundational understanding of social science and educational research methods and the statistical strategies to support education research by conducting a scholarly research project focused on a challenge in medical education.
- read and analyze articles in primary journals on medical education.
- collaborate with peers and serve as mentors to others who are interested in medical education research.
- formulate a strong research question, hypothesis, and methods consistent with rigorous research techniques in this area.
- embrace their responsibility as professionals in academic medicine by being contributors of education research to the field.

This workshop is intended for physicians and generalists in medical education, as well as faculty and staff involved in student affairs, who wish to develop perspectives and skills for collecting qualitative data, such as data from focus group discussions, interviews, observation field notes, and responses to open-ended questions used in admissions processes, program development, curriculum evaluation, needs assessments, performance evaluation, and various scholarship and research applications. After participating in this workshop, learners will be able to:

- Demonstrate applied knowledge of the appropriate selection, use, and standards for rigor of some common methods for collection of qualitative data.
- Generate research questions appropriate for qualitative studies and choose appropriate data collection methods.
- Demonstrate applied knowledge of approaches to achieve rigor in the design of qualitative studies and collection of qualitative data.
- Demonstrate essential skills required for conducting focus groups.

Measuring Educational Outcomes with Reliability and Validity

This workshop introduces participants to the principles of score reliability and validity, using a combination of didactics and review of medical education research projects. The workshop is divided into two parts with group exercises designed to reinforce understanding of the main principles. At the end of the workshop the participants will be able to:

- Identify three types of reliability (inter-rater, test-retest, and internal consistency).
- Match types of reliability with appropriate statistical measures.
- Describe the relationship between reliability and validity.
- Describe multiple forms of evidence for validity.
- Select an approach to reliability and validity assessment for a particular study.

- Identify the goals and objectives of developing a track.
- Discuss how to utilize local, regional, and national resources to develop a track.
- Determine the pros and cons of developing a track.

Hear Best Practices in Narrative Assessment and Strategies for Providing Faculty Development on this Topic

- Describe features of high-quality narrative assessment.
- Develop a framework for providing narrative assessment that is specific and provides learners with actionable suggestions for improved performance.
- Create a faculty development workshop at your own institution on how to improve narrative assessment.

Become Familiar with the Concept of Psychological Safety, Its Benefits for the Learning Environment and Learner, and Practical Methods to Foster It

- Demonstrate an understanding of the characteristics of a psychological safe environment and of a psychologically unsafe learning environment.
- Hear the evidence that supports the centrality of psychological safety in medical education and the missed opportunities from conventional models of learning.
- Apply ideas and methods of creating a psychologically safe learning environment to case-based scenarios and discussions of evidence-based techniques.

Develop Strategies to Prepare for National Policies Impacting GME

- Explain changes to existing ACGME Requirements.
- Identify changes to ACGME IM Subspecialty Milestones
- Ask questions about ACGME policies and processes, including site visits.

Abstract Awards

APCCMPD Award for Medical Education Research

Recognizes pulmonary and critical care medicine training program directors, associate program directors, faculty and fellows-intraining for their outstanding contributions and commitment to medical education research. The research project focus may be directed toward undergraduate or graduate medical education in the fields of pulmonary or critical care.

APCCMPD Award for Novel Medical Education Implementation

Recognizes pulmonary and critical care medicine training program directors, associate program directors, faculty, and fellows-intraining for their outstanding contributions and commitment to medical education and training. To be eligible, applicants must submit an abstract describing a novel and innovative educational/training approach they have applied to their training program.

APCCMPD Award for Innovative Fellowship Program Administration

Recognizes outstanding contributions to fellowship program administration through the development of novel best practices in pulmonary, critical care, and pulmonary/critical care medicine fellowship programs.

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
