

Abstract Awards

APCCMPD Award for Medical Education Research

Recognizes pulmonary and critical care medicine training program directors, associate program directors, faculty and fellows-intraining for their outstanding contributions and commitment to medical education research. The research project focus may be directed toward undergraduate or graduate medical education in the fields of pulmonary or critical care.

APCCMPD Award for Novel Fellowship Education Implementation

Recognizes pulmonary and critical care medicine training program directors, associate program directors, faculty, and fellows-intraining for their outstanding contributions and commitment to fellowship medical education and training. To be eligible, applicants must submit an abstract describing novel and innovative curricular development they have implemented in their program.

APCCMPD Award for Innovative Fellowship Program Administration

Recognizes outstanding contributions to fellowship program administration through the development of novel best practices in pulmonary, critical care, and pulmonary/critical care medicine fellowship programs.




